McHugh fire cause determined to be unextinguished campfire

(Anchorage, AK) – The Division of Forestry announced today that the cause of the McHugh Fire was an unextinguished campfire. The McHugh wildfire began July 16 in Chugach State Park, south of Anchorage and adjacent to the Seward Highway. The point of origin of the escaped fire was north of the McHugh Creek parking lot, off the McHugh trail system and deep in a ravine. The fire was started in an area not commonly used by hikers and not in an established campfire ring.

Escaped campfires are preventable. Before leaving a campfire unattended, ensure it is fully extinguished by dousing with water, stirring and dousing again until no heat is present.
