

#### **BRIEF DESCRIPTION**

The Department of Natural Resources proposes to amend its water management regulations.

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On January 15, 2021, the Department of Natural Resources publicly noticed its proposed changes to water management regulations in 11 AAC 93. The department extended the

comment period twice, on February 26, and on March 16, 2021, with a final deadline for comments on April 2, 2021. The department reviewed public comments and is opting to postpone proposed changes relating to applications and certificates for instream flow reservations. The department will move forward with the remaining regulation changes proposed in the January 2021 regulations package:

11 AAC 93.115 Closure of an application for a water right
11 AAC 93.210 Temporary water use
11 AAC 93.220 Procedure for temporary water use
11 AAC 93.510 Public notice and meeting (for Critical Water Management Areas)
11 AAC 93.530 Effect of the order
11 AAC 93.970 Definitions

Some modifications have been made to the January 2021 proposed changes after a thorough review of public comments. The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) received the Supplemental Notice of Proposed Changes Relating to Water Management in the Regulations of the Department of Natural Resources signed October 6, 2023. This notice informed BLM of the opportunity to comment on the water regulation revisions proposed by the Alaska Department of Natural Resources (ADNR). BLM is in the process of reviewing these proposed changes prior to the comment period deadline that has been recently extended from November 13, 2023 to November 30, 2023. As part of the review, several questions have arisen which are listed below. The ADNR responses to these questions will provide the BLM with better understanding and context for the framing of our comments.

Specific questions to the proposed regulation changes are below.

#### 1. Page 1. 11 AAC 93.115 Closure of an application for a water right

ADNR proposes the following changes: "(4) the applicant fails to provide information requested under 11 AAC 93.070 or fails to complete the newspaper notice of the proposed appropriation, in which case the **commissioner will notify the applicant** [WILL BE NOTIFIED] by certified mail that the application has been closed, noting the reason for **and effective date of** the closure[, THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE CLOSURE, AND ANY APPEAL PROCESS].

#### BLM Question: Please provide the rationale for removing the text referencing the appeal process.

#### 2. Page 2. 11 AAC 93.210 Temporary water use

ADNR proposed the following addition to the existing regulation: "(a) Procedures to authorize the temporary use of water, as provided in 11 AAC 93.220, will apply if the use continues for less than five consecutive years and the water applied for is not otherwise appropriated <u>under a</u> <u>permit to appropriate water, certificate of appropriation, certificate of reservation, or change permit."</u>

<u>BLM Question: How would this proposed change account for consideration of reservation of water</u> <u>applications either waiting for adjudication or during adjudication, but prior to the issuing of a</u> <u>certificate?</u>

#### 3. Page 3. 11 AAC 93.510 Public notice and meeting

ADNR proposes adoption of the following: part (b) "(1) owners of property in the geographic area affected by the proposed designation, revocation, or amendment;"

#### 4. Page 4. 11 AAC 93.510. Public Notice and meeting

ADNR proposes adoption of the following: part (b): "(2) appropriators of record on a water source affected by the proposed designation, revocation, or amendment; (3) existing applicants for a water right on a water source affected by the proposed designation, revocation, or amendment; (4) existing applicants for, or holders of, a temporary water use authorization on a water source affected by the proposed designation, revocation, or amendment; (5) affected federal, state, and local agencies, including the Department of Fish and Game and the Department of Environmental Conservation; and"

<u>BLM Question: What is the rationale for exclusion of notification of existing water reservation</u> <u>applicants? Other water right applicants are included explicitly, but water reservation applicants are</u> excluded.

<u>BLM Question: How will it be determined if federal agencies will be affected? Will this determination</u> <u>include consideration of federal applications for water reservations affected by the proposed</u> <u>actions?</u>

#### 5. Page 6. 11 AAC 93.970(25)

ADNR proposes the following changes: "(25) 'appropriators of record' means [APPLICANTS FOR, AND PERMITTEES AND CERTIFICATE] holders <u>of permits to appropriate water, certificates of</u> <u>appropriation, certificates of reservation, or change permits</u>[, WATER RIGHTS]

<u>BLM Question: Please describe the needs for and the problems to be solved by the proposed</u> <u>definition change to "appropriators of record."</u>

<u>BLM Question: How will the seniority of unadjudicated water right and reservation applications be</u> <u>considered in ADNR actions if they are no longer included in the definition of "appropriators of</u> <u>record?"</u>

This letter contains questions regarding the recent Alaska Department of Natural Resources (ADNR) supplemental proposal to revise regulations in Title 11 of the Alaska Administrative Code (AAC), relating to the closure of water right applications, the procedures for temporary water use, public notices and hearings on critical water management areas, and definitions.

I am seeking clarification on aspects of the proposed changes to Title 11 of the AAC prior to the submittal of comments from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) regarding the proposed changes. The questions and requests for clarification are listed in the order they appear in the proposed changes document and are not necessarily in the order of importance to the Service.

**Question 1: Referring to the proposed changes for 11 AAC 93.115(4)**, page 1: "the applicant fails to provide information requested under 11 AAC 93.070... [AND ANY APPEAL PROCESS].

• What is the intent of not notifying an applicant of the appeal process? Is there intent or has the appeal process been eliminated?

#### Question 2: Referring to the proposed changes for 11 AAC 93.210(a), page 2:

- Will ADNR issue certificates of reservations or water rights prior to granting temporary water use permits on systems with pending reservation or water right applications? If not,
  - Will ADNR provide further clarity on the standing of applicants for a reservation of water or water right when considering a temporary water use authorization if the proposed regulations are adopted?
- Will ADNR account for the requested water in pending applications for reservations of water and water rights when considering a temporary water use authorization? If so,
  - How does ADNR intend to account for the requested water, and how will the applicants for a reservation of water or a water right be involved?
- Will ADNR please explain the implications to applications for water reservations and water rights?

**Question 3: Referring to the proposed changes for 11 AAC 93.510**, page 3-4: The new language ADNR proposes for 11 AAC 93.510 includes notification of existing applicants for a water right (b)(3) and temporary water use authorizations (b)(4). However, the proposed regulation does not specify contacting existing applicants for reservations of water.

- Why does ADNR not specify contacting existing applicants for water reservations while explicitly including applicants for water rights and temporary water use authorizations?
- What is ADNR's intent with excluding applicants for water reservations from being notified, and how does ADNR intend to recognize the standing of Reservation applicants in critical water management area decisions?
- Regarding the language "geographic area" in (b)(1): How does ADNR define "geographic area"?
- Regarding the language "affected" in both (b)(1) and (b)(5): How does ADNR define "affected"?

**Question 4: Referring to the proposed changes for 11 AAC 93.970(25)**, page 6: The new language ADNR proposes removes "applicants for" from the definition of "appropriators of record."

• How does ADNR intend to recognize the standing of applicants for a water reservation or water right that has yet to be adjudicated?

The Service requests answers to the questions herein to clarify the changes in the 11 AAC 93 prior to compiling and submitting official comments to ADNR. ADNR's response will provide the information necessary for the Service to provide clear comment on the changes to 11 AAC 93 without assumptions to the questions herein.

The Alaska Region US Forest Service would like to take this opportunity to present questions regarding the proposed revision of the Title 11 regulations in the State of Alaska Administrative Code. We are seeking clarification on aspects of the proposed changes to Title 11 of the AAC prior to the submittal of comments from the Alaska Region US Forest Service regarding the proposed changes. The questions and requests for clarification are listed in the order they appear in the proposed changes document and are not necessarily in the order of importance to the Forest Service.

Question 1: 11 AAC 93.115(4). "the applicant fails to provide information requested under 11 AAC 93.070 or fails to complete the newspaper notice of the proposed appropriation, in which case the commissioner will notify the applicant [WILL BE NOTIFIED] by certified mail that the application has been closed, noting the reason for and effective date of the closure [, THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE CLOSURE, AND ANY APPEAL PROCESS]."

• This could be interpreted as eliminating any potential appeal process. Is it intended to? If the intent is to keep the appeal process, what is the rationale for not notifying an applicant of the appeal process?

Question 2: 11 AAC 93.210(a) Procedures to authorize the temporary use of water, as provided in 11 AAC 93.220, will apply if the use continues for less than five consecutive years and the water applied for is not otherwise appropriated under a permit to appropriate water, certificate of appropriation, certificate of reservation, or change permit.

- The Forest Service and its partners at the Alaska Department of Fish and Game have numerous outstanding applications for reservations of water for instream flows sufficient to protect the resources therein on the Tongass and Chugach National Forests. These unadjudicated applications convey priority standing and warrants consultation on any temporary water use applications which might affect these reservations. What is the reason for not consulting with applicants of reservations of water?
- Why can DNR process a temporary use of water sooner than an instream flow reservation?
- Will any temporary water use applications consider the flow volumes requested by instream flow reservations, as if they are adjudicated?

Question 3: 11 AAC 93.510(b)1. owners of property in the geographic area affected by the proposed designation, revocation, or amendment;



• What is considered the geographic area affected by the proposed designation?

Question 4: 11 AAC 93.510(b)1-5.

• Why does the proposed language not include applicants for reservations of water? As proposed, all other parties with standing when DNR designates, revokes, or amends critical water management areas is notified of potential actions but unadjudicated instream flow applicants are explicitly excluded?

Question 5: 11 AAC 93.970(25). "appropriators of record" means [APPLICANTS FOR, AND PERMITTEES AND CERTIFICATE] holders of permits to appropriate water, certificates of appropriation, certificates of reservation, or change permits [, WATER RIGHTS]

- Why does this proposed definition purposefully exclude *applicants for* reservations of water?
- Since the definition of "adjudication" (11 AAC 93.970(1)) incorporates the definition of "appropriators of record," the definition of "adjudication" is also being significantly changed. Is the intent of this rule change to remove consideration of applicants for water rights from all adjudications?
- If not all, in which adjudications would applicants for water rights not be considered, and what is the rationale for their exclusion?
- If consideration of applicants for water rights are removed from adjudications, how would this regulatory change comport with the statutory requirement in § 46.15.165 (Administrative Adjudications) to serve "each applicant, certificate holder, or permitee listed in the department's records within the adjudication area"?

We respectfully request response to our questions to clarify the proposed changes to Title II prior to compiling and submitting final comments to ADNR. ADNR's response will provide the information necessary for the Forest Service to provide relevant comments on the changes without assumptions to the questions articulated above. Since final comments are due by November 30, 2023, it is unclear if we can expect DNR responses to our questions prior to that date? We hope that DNR will allow adequate time to formulate final agency comments or otherwise provide a reasonable extension.
